





# Flowering Dogwood

Flowering dogwoods were chosen for the grove of the plaza. The not only provide a biodiverse habitat for their environments, but add ornamentation to the space as well.

## Grey-headed Coneflower

Grey-headed coneflowers, along with other prarie grasses and plants will fill the concrete pad's cracks. The grey-headed coneflower supports green lacewings, which play an important role in controlling aphid populations.

# Swamp White Oak

Swamp white oaks surround the perimeter of the plaza. Because of their expansive roots, they will break up the existing concrete pad to make room for new vegetation. Swamp white oaks are native to Missouri and provide rich biodiversity to their environments.

## Echeveria

Echevarrias were chosen to fill the spaces in between the concrete pavers. Echevarrias are a sturdy plant that can withstand foot traffic. They are the perfect fit for the track end of the site where people will be riding bikes or walking through.
