THE SCHOOL OF LAW

At the mid-year commencement, the following Law School Prizes were awarded: Richard Wagner Brown Prize, to the student best exemplifying scholarship, leadership, and character: James David Hennigan; Samuel M. Breckinridge Scholarship Prizes, awarded to the students having the highest averages in their respective classes: for the second year class, 1941-1942, Horace S. Haseltine, first, Myron Gollub, second; for the first year class, 1941-1942, William H. Frey, first, Elmer Price, second. Final Honors were awarded to James David Hennigan and Rodham W. Kenner.

The following members of the Class of February, 1943, were elected to membership in the Order of Coif: James David Hennigan and Rodham W. Kenner.

The School of Law has for the February 1943 term a total enrollment of forty-five, with an entering class of four. As compared with the enrollment in September 1942, the total student body shows a decrease of forty per cent.
